

Scholarship Application for Ensembles September 2023 - August 2024

The Paul Thorpe Music Education Fund at Asheville Music School has been created in honor of Paul Thorpe, director of AMS, 2003-2011, to bring music lessons, instruments, and outreach to our community and those in need. Scholarship awards are determined by a committee of Asheville Music School board members and the Scholarship Manager.

Scholarships are awarded annually. Families must re-apply for scholarships each year. Families who are awarded scholarship funds through the PTMEF are strongly encouraged to contribute back to AMS by volunteering at least 4 hours during the scholarship year.

Criteria for award includes:

- Placement in an AMS ensemble is a prerequisite
- Proof of financial need
- Evidence of commitment to music education
- If re-applying, past record of volunteer hours completed

To apply: **Completed Applications must be received by <u>August 31, 2023</u>**. No late or incomplete applications will be considered. Applications may be emailed to <u>scholarships@ashevillemusicschool.org</u>. Paper copies may be mailed or hand delivered to the AMS office. The deadline is a RECEIPT date.

A completed application consists of:

- Completed application form
- Personal statements from Student and Parent
- Proof of financial need
 - o Copy of 2023 Federal individual income tax return Form 1040 (pages 1 and 2).
 - W-2 forms are not acceptable.
 - If you do not file an individual tax return, you may submit one of the following:
 - Copy of Social Security Benefits statement (if applicable)
 - Proof of government assistance (if applicable)
 - If you have questions about financial need documentation, please contact the Scholarship Manager well in advance of the deadline.
